David Thornhill

David worked construction and other jobs in the Northeast, but after work began to run out, he relocated to Florida and lived with a friend of a friend. Eventually that arrangement couldn't continue and his addiction to alcohol led him to life on the streets.

After five years of intermittent homelessness, he found his way to The Lord's Place, and by what he describes as "a miracle," entered The Lord's Place Operation Home Ready program. He is now sober and enjoys life living in an apartment he proudly maintains in spotless condition.

"At one point I couldn't imagine having the life I have now, with a roof over my head and people who care about me," he said. "You know how The Lord's Place says their mission is to break the cycle of homeless? Well, they're not messing around. They

really mean it and they do it."

In the Kitchen with Massimo Marrou

Homeless people always can find a good meal at The Lord's Place's Café Joshua. Some of them learn how to cook good meals there, too, through Café Joshua's Culinary Apprenticeship program and with Joshua Catering Company. The skills they master can help them get a job in the food service industry.

On hand to help them at Café Joshua is Chef de Cuisine Massimo Marrou. Locals may remember him as the force behind a commercial kitchen and delivery service he opened in Lake Worth in 2011 called I Don't Feel Like Cooking Tonight. He prepared authentic Italian, French and Spanish dishes to provide gourmet meals for those who wanted good food, but didn't want to (or didn't have time to) cook themselves, hence the moniker.

He sold the business (now the Sugar Monkey bakery) last year and found his way to The Lord's Place. [continue reading](#)
